2013 has seen the 40th anniversary for Martin Cooper's first mobile phone call. Current smartphones and tablet computers connected to



powerful cloud services through fast network connectivity introduce a step-change in almost every sense. the emphasis is rapidly shifting from voice, packet switching and short messages on services closely linked to telecommunications operators towards data-intense Internet services delivered through a browser or through the more than 2 million different apps. Whilst this phenomenon is racing ahead and an increasing range of services are represented on mobile platforms, research is seeking to understand and contextualise its more theoretical significance, for example, in terms of the innovation dynamics, the emergence of new standards and infrastructures, new user interaction modalities, new business models, the discussion of the consumerisation of IT, and many more subjects. One way of characterising the dynamics of the current mobile revolution is the complex and contradictory balancing of the highly generative opportunities for decentralised innovation through digital technology with the deep reliance on digital infrastructures enabling such distributed activities.
