Paper Submission Requirements:

All submitted paper must:

- be written in English;
- contain author names, affiliations, and email addresses;
- be formatted according to the ACM SIG Proceedings template (<http://www.acm.org/sigs/publications/proceedings-templates>) with a font size no smaller than 9pt;
- be in PDF (make sure that the PDF can be viewed on any platform), and formatted for US Letter size;
- occupy no more than ten pages, including the abstract and appendices, but excluding references.

It is the authors' responsibility to ensure that their submission adheres strictly to the required format. Submissions that do not comply with the above guidelines may be rejected without review.

Call for Papers - Demo Track

The Demo Track allows researchers and practitioners to demonstrate new systems in a dedicated session. Demo submissions must be based on an implemented and tested system that pursues one or more innovative ideas in the interest areas of the conference. Demos from the traditional research community are of course strongly encouraged, but proposals from other activity areas are also welcome, as we envisage to open demo sessions to the larger public. Software (including games or learning platforms) and hardware demos will also be considered, as long as they show innovative use of Web-based techniques.

Each demo submission must make clear which aspects of the system will be demonstrated, and how. They should strive to state the significance of the contribution to Web technology or applications. Demos will be peer-reviewed by members of the Demo Track Program Committee, who will judge the originality, significance, quality, and clarity of each submission.

At least one author of each accepted demo paper must register for and attend the conference, and demonstrate the system during the demo sessions (please see the Conference Policies). Each accepted demo paper will be allocated no more than four pages in the conference proceedings. Demo authors are not required to transfer copyright.

== Submission guidelines ==

Demo submissions must be formatted according to the ACM SIG Proceedings Template and are limited to four pages. Submissions must be in PDF and must be done through the EasyChair system.

To better identify the value of demos, as well as to reach out to external audiences, we also encourage authors to submit a pointer to a screencast, using web-accessible platforms such as Vimeo or Youtube. The maximum duration of screencasts is 10 minutes.

Call for PhD Symposium

In conjunction with the 23rd International World Wide Web Conference, April 7 – April 11, 2014, Seoul, Korea :<http://www2014.kr>, the PhD Symposium of www2014 provides an excellent opportunity both for the beginners as well as the senior PhD students to present their ideas, and receive feedback on their work by experienced researchers and other PhD Students working in research areas related to the World Wide Web. The symposium welcomes submissions by PhD candidates working on the topics of www2014. You can consult the list of www2014 topics.

Eligibility :The Symposium is open to all PhD Students. PhD Students at the beginning of their work are particularly welcome when they have a well-defined problem statement and some ideas about the solution that they want to discuss. PhD students in a more advanced stage of their work should still have a sufficient time before completing their dissertation to be able to benefit from the symposium experience.

Submission guidelines :Submissions should be written based on the following structure, which focuses on the key methodological components required for a sound research synthesis :

Problem	describe the core problem of the PhD and motivate its relevance
State of the art	describe relevant related work
Proposed approach	present the approach taken and motivate how this is novel with respect to existing works
Methodology	sketch the methodology that is (or will be) adopted and, in particular, the approach to be taken for evaluating the results of the work
Results	describe the current status of the work and any results that have been reached so far
Conclusions and future work	conclude and specify the major items of future work.

Submissions must be no longer than 5 pages and must be formatted in the style of the www2014 submissions (which is based on the ACM SIG Proceedings style). Papers must be in PDF (Adobe's Portable Document Format) format and must be submitted electronically.

Submissions must be single-author, on the topic of the doctoral work. The name of the supervisor must be clearly marked (« supervised by ... ») on the paper, under the author's name.

Selection process :All submissions will be reviewed by the Symposium Program Committee composed of experienced researchers, who can provide feedback and suggest future research directions. All the accepted PhD Symposium papers will be included in the same Companion Volume with the papers from the tracks of Posters, Demos, and Developer, and made available through the ACM Digital Library.

WWW 2014 will feature a number of co-located workshops that are intended to provide a forum for researchers and practitioners in Web technologies to discuss and exchange positions on current and emergent Web topics. Workshop attendants will exchange ideas and experience, establish common ground in research areas or practical problems, and hopefully identify new opportunities for collaboration and new directions for future activity. Preference will be given to timely topics that will favor highly interactive discussions. WWW 2014 will offer logistic support for the workshops, where registration, catering, room allocation and audio/visual will be arranged by the conference organizers. The supported workshops will take place on the 7th and 8th of April 2014, before the main conference, at the conference venue.

A workshop proposal must include:

- A concise title.
- The names and affiliations of the organizers; a typical workshop should count no more than three co-chairs affiliated with different organizations.
- Proposed duration of the workshop (half or full day.)
- Preference for a date; but, the proposal must not be conditioned on the workshop date, since it is likely that some workshops will not get their preferred date
- A statement of the workshop: objective/goals
- A statement detailing: Why is the workshop topic important? Why is the workshop timely? How is it relevant to WWW?
- A two-paragraph description of the workshop topic and themes.
- If the workshop was conducted before, where and when was it conducted? (Please give details on number of attendees, number of submissions, and acceptance ratio.
- A description of the workshop format: How many papers do you hope to present, how many invited speakers, type of activities (e.g., short paper presentation, invited talks, demos, posters, etc.), and an

approximate timeline (breaks should be synchronized with scheduled breaks if possible.)

- A description of how workshop submissions will be evaluated, and a tentative PC list (with indication of whether PC members have already been contacted and/or have expressed interest.)
- An indication on whether the workshop registration will be open to all interested registered parties or limited.
- A short bio of the workshop organizers, including a description of their qualifications relative to the topic area, and past experience in organizing/facilitating workshops or research meetings.

Submission:

Workshop proposals should be no more than five pages in length (10pt with reasonable margins) and must be in PDF written in English.
