Regular Paper submission

We invite submissions of technical research papers describing original and unpublished results related to Information Systems development and/or operations including methodological, technological, economical or social aspects. All submissions will undergo a double-blind peer-review process. We accept full papers having a maximum length of **12 pages**, including references and appendices; and short papers having a maximum length of **8 pages**, including references and appendices. Short papers provide an opportunity to describe work in progress and emergent or partial research results; there's also the possibility that certain full paper submissions will be accepted as short papers, if they report promising research but are still in an early stage or early development iteration. All submissions must be in the appropriate format using the ISD template.

New Ideas and Vision Paper submission

We also solicit papers that present new ideas and visions. Papers on new ideas may describe new, non-conventional research positions or approaches of information systems development that depart from standard practice. We also welcome vision papers which will be on long-term challenges and opportunities in information systems development research that are outside of current mainstream topics of the field. "New Ideas/Vision" papers must not exceed **5 pages** for the main text, including all figures, tables, appendices, etc. **One more page** containing only references is permitted.

Poster and Journal-first submission

Posters provide an opportunity for researchers and practitioners to present and discuss their most recent research achievements practical experience, tools and challenges related to Information Systems development. Such submissions consist of an extended abstract of **2 to 4 pages plus one page** for references. If the poster is accepted, the authors must prepare the actual poster to be posted and presented at the conference.

We also invite journal-first presentations of papers recently published in prestigious journals (accepted after 1 Jan. 2021), in the scope of the conference tracks. Such presentations typically stimulate awareness on novel research results, foster citations and inspire new research streams or collaboration opportunities.

Proceedings

The ISD Proceedings will be published in the AIS eLibrary. To be included in the proceedings, the paper must be presented at the conference by one of the authors. In addition, a selection of full papers (by invitation) will be published by Springer as a separate volume of the Lecture Notes in Information Systems and Organization series, which is indexed by Scopus, DBLP, etc.
